Miss Matthews - Learning Support Assistant will be leaving at the end of this term after securing a role working with a national mental health charity.


We wish Miss Matthews all the best for the future.

Learning at Whitehall—Last Week of Term

The countdown to Christmas started this week and it is always a very special time of the year for all. Our Christmas tree in the hall was beautifully decorated with hand crafted decorations by the children in all year groups and each child was able to hang up their own decoration on the tree during our Christmas Tree Assembly.

Whilst Christmas is a very busy time with lots of creative activities, it is important to remember why Christmas is celebrated. Christmas is an important celebration for all Christians and Non-Christians too around the world.

In Nursery we have read the 'Christmas Story' which is about the birth of baby Jesus and talked about key vocabulary. We also talked about how it is celebrated as well as comparing similarities to other festivals that we have celebrated so far eg Diwali.

In Reception children have been learning about how and why Christmas is celebrated, retelling the nativity story and using songs and crafts to understand the cultural side of Christmas as part of the Early Years 'Understanding of the World' area of learning.

In Year One the children also learnt about how Christmas is celebrated by Christians all over the world and how they celebrate with different traditions depending on their culture.

Year Two have been learning about the different ways Christmas is celebrated from one family to the next including which aspects of Christmas are most important to different people e.g. for some it is about Jesus whilst for others it's about family time and togetherness. Year Two are also focusing on our school value of Respect and respecting the practices of others. Children have also discussed the reasons for the giving of gifts at Christmas - linking it to gift giving in other faith celebrations.

As a school, we understand that this time of year can be very busy with lots of activities happening for children to enjoy. We try to keep to our usual routine as much as possible to support children to self regulate and support them in advance with any changes that may occur.

Reading Eggs and Maths Seeds

You will have seen in previous newsletters and as part of home learning that we have purchased the license for Reading Eggs and Maths Seeds again this year.

Feedback from children and parents over the last year was positive and children really enjoyed the games and additional practice in these crucial areas.

Reading Eggs also has a large online library of books that children can read.

Your child has their log in information in their reading records. Please ensure that you do log on with your child so that they can access these resources. Teachers have introduced these resources to children in the classrooms.

Staying Safe

One of our school values is 'Safe' and we want every child to be as safe as possible.

During the winter months, please take care on paths and pavements as they can become icy. Please also ensure that you and your child are wearing footwear that is appropriate for this weather. Our premises team do a great job of making sure the paths around the school are gritted so that they are safe to walk.

Although ice and snow can be exciting for children (and us as adults) it is important that we keep ourselves as safe as possible. Stay away from open water and under no circumstances venture on to ice regardless of how thick or safe you think it may be.

The UKHSA has issued reminders that in the UK the weather will **never be cold enough** to make ice thick enough on lakes and ponds for a person to walk on.

Did you know that you can wash your child's red book bag in the washing machine? Ensure you empty the bag first and put on a cool or delicates wash (30 degrees). Don't put light or white colours in with the book bag.

Applying for Nursery School

For children due to start Nursery in September 2024, you must apply direct to the school. If your child's date of birth falls between **1st September 2023 and 31st August 2024** and they **turn 3**, then you can apply for entry in September 2024. Applying for Primary School

For children due to start Reception in September 2024 (date of birth should fall between 1 September 2019 and 31st August 2020) you must apply for a Primary School place by **15th January 2024**. Applications should be made online at:


